Representative Frank Farry was first elected to serve the people of the 142nd Legislative District in 2008. During the 2015-16 session, he has been appointed to serve on the House Consumer Affairs, Health and Local Government committees, along with the House Veterans Affairs and Emergency Preparedness Committee, where he continues to chair the Sub-Committee on Security and Emergency Response Readiness. In addition, Rep. Farry serves as a House Republican Deputy Whip and chairman of the House Firefighters and Emergency Services Caucus. In addition to his professional endeavors, Farry is also very active in his community, serving as a volunteer firefighter with the Langhorne-Middletown Fire Company since June 1990 and as chief of the organization since January 2001. He currently serves on the board of trustees for Bucks County Community College, is a past board member of the Middletown Community Foundation and the Lower Bucks Chapter of the American Red Cross, past president of the Bucks County Consortium of Municipalities, and has served on numerous township and county boards and commissions. Before being elected to serve the people of the 142nd District, Farry served as assistant township manager and director of community services for Middletown Township from October 2000 to June 2008. He also worked as a legal intern in the U.S. Department of Justice. He received a bachelor of science in economics from the University of Pennsylvania, a master of science in public policy from Rutgers University and a juris doctor from Rutgers University School of Law. Farry currently resides in Langhorne, where he is an attorney at the law firm of Begley, Carlin & Mandio.
