Gov. Christie income tax cut has support, but many overestimate what they'd get, survey finds

TRENTON — More than half of New Jersey registered voters support Gov. Chris Christie's plan to cut income taxes by 10 percent, according to a new Eagleton-Rutgers poll, though many voters were uncertain of or overestimate how much money they would save.

Support for the plan was nearly equal across the economic spectrum, including among lower-income respondents whose benefit would be less because their bills and New Jersey tax rates are lower.

Christie is expected to include the first installment of a three-year plan to reduce income taxes by 10 percent in the budget he outlines in a speech to a joint session of the Legislature at 2 p.m. today.

The Eagleton-Rutgers Poll 52 percent of registered voters support the proposal, while 36 percent oppose.

Even among those who expect to save \$200 or less, there was nearly as much support as opposition.

Many voters expect the savings to be much higher, though.

While one-third of voters wouldn't venture a guess about how much the plan would save their family, 14 percent thought it would exceed \$2,000.

Eight percent more thought it would be between \$1,000 and \$2,000.

The average estimated savings among those who responded was \$2,364. The median — meaning half said more, half said less — was \$746.

A household would need taxable income of a little over \$180,000 to see a \$746 benefit from a 10 percent cut in income taxes.

"People do not have a good sense of how much they pay in state income tax and what a 10 percent savings means," said poll director David Redlawsk.

"This leads them to overestimate their own



gain, which may affect their support for the proposal." Ten percent of respondents with incomes under \$50,000 thought they would save more than \$2,000. Their total state tax bill is \$805 or less.
